## INTRODUCTION

# HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

The Government College of Education, Saidapet is the oldest teacher training institution in our country. It is also the largest teacher training centre in our State. Its origin is to be traced back to the Government Normal School opened in Vepery on the first of March 1856. The affiliation of the Normal School with the University of Madras in 1887 marks the next important stage in its history. The institution came to be called the Teachers' College and the college was shifted to Saidapet the same year. The College building was constructed in 1889. The College presented students for the first time to the L. T. Examination in 1888. Till then the College had its own College Teachers' Certificate Examination. Students were given the option of appearing for the L. T. Examination of the University or for the Collegiate Teachers' Certificate Examination of the Department till 1892. The Collegiate Teachers' Certificate Examination was abolished in 1892. The College hostel was constructed in 1897. A special block of building was erected in 1904 to accommodate the kindergarten section. The Manual Training section was opened in 1914. In 1944 the University reorganised the L. T. Course changing its name as the B. T. course. In 1949, the Pandits' Training section was added to the College. In 1949 the Collegiate Teachers' Certificate course was started for Secondary grade teachers with a degree. In 1952 this Collegiate Teachers' Certificate course was affiliated to the Madras University and came to be known as the Shortened B. T. course. The M. Ed. Class on inter-collegiate basis was introduced in the college in 1953. In 1972, the University reorganised the B. T. course and gave its present name, the B. Ed. Course. The M. Ed. course (Evening class) was introduced in the college in 1974. The shortened B. T. Course was suspended in November 1975. Department of Extension services was started in 1956-57. The Diploma in Higher Education course was introduced in the college in 1977-78. The college celebrated its Post Centenary Silver Jubilee (125th year) on 30-3-1981. M. Phil course was introduced in 1986.

- 1953 The M. Ed. class introduced, on an intercollegiate basis.
- 1956 Centenary Celebrations.
- 1972 The University of Madras reorganised the B.T. course and named it as the B. Ed. course.
- 1974 The M. Ed. course (Evening college) began with one elective Advanced Educational Psychology.
- 1975 The M. Ed. (Evening college) Additional affiliation granted for elective Advanced Educational Administration. Shortened B. Ed. course suspended in November.
- 1977 The Diploma in Higher Education course began on 1st Dec. 1977.
- 1981 Post Centenary Silver Jubilee celebrations.
- 1981 The name of "Teachers' College" changed as "Government College of Education".
- 1986 M. Phil. course introduced.

**LOCATION:** The college with its campus of about 20.5 hectares is situated near river Adyar on Anna Road at a distance of about 9.2 km from Fort St. George. The distance from Saidapet station to the College is about 200 metres. The location of the College offers at once the advantages of urban communication and rural seclusion.

### COLLEGE LEAVING CERTIFICATE

Students of the B.Ed. class will be granted at the end of the course a College Leaving Certificate signed by the Principal showing their progress in practical work and their attendance and conduct. This is the only certificate issued by the College. No member of the staff will issue any certificate.

In case of necessity, a separate conduct certificate may be issued by the Principal, on requisition which must be accompanied by a late fee of Rs 3-00 (Rupees three only) in case of applications made one year after completion of the course.

### TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION

A Teachers' Association Functions in the College and study of and discussion of topics of educational, professional and general interest constitute the programme of the Association. The Principal is the Ex. Officio President of the Association, and a Professor nominated by the Principal will be in general charge of the Association. The senior most member of every faculty will be the Vice-president of the respective Subject Association. A General Secretary for the Teachers' Association and the Secretaries of the Subjects Association of the B.Ed. and other courses will form the working committee of the Teachers' Association. Its main function will be to arrange the programme of work of the Association for the year. All the students of the College are members of the Teachers' Association and are expected to take keen interest in its activities.

## SOCIAL SERVICE LEAGUE

All Students of the Regular B.Ed. and Tamil Teachers' Training Course are subscribing members of the College Social Service League. The Principal is the President and a Professor or an Assistant Professor nominated by him is the Vice-President of the League. A Student Secretary and a representative from each course elected at the beginning of the year form the standing committee. The Free Adult Night School conducted under the auspices of the School Service League offers opportunities to the College students to render well defined and sustained voluntary social service during the period of their study in the College. Other Service projects may be organized and conducted by the standing committee of the League.

## STIPENDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

(a) Scholarships are sanctioned by the Ministry of Education, Government of India to approved applicants from the College. Such applications should be made on or before the 15th July of the year. Students are informed that belated applications will not be forwarded.

(b) The Harijan Welfare Department offers scholarships, residential and non-residential, to a few students of this College

(c) The disbursement of the scholarships and stipends is subject to regular attendance and satisfactory progress of the students. Students are particularly warned against absence for any reason whatever, either in advance or in continuation of college holidays, as stipends in such cases will be withheld for the total period of absence including holidays.

Note:— Students should put in 90% of attendance to become eligible for Scholarships.

## RAILWAY CONCESSIONS

Application forms for journey concession and season ticket at concessional rates can be had from the college library, Journey concession forms will be made available to the students for going home for recognised holidays and coming at the end of the holidays and for other purpose like educational tours, excursions etc. sponsored by the college, **Students are not eligible to apply for the concession during other holidays.** Further particulars may be obtained from the college librarian.

## PROBATION

Each student shall be considered to be on probation for 50 working days, and if it appears to the Principal that any student is not likely to prove an efficient teacher, such student will be required to leave the institution. During the

probation a stipendary shall be entitled to draw the full amount of his stipend and if rejected at the end of the period of probation he shall not be required to refund the amount drawn provided his ejection was not due to moral delinquency.

### TUTORIAL SYSTEM

1. For the purpose of effective guidance and supervision all students trainees, residing either in the Hostel or outside, will be under the supervision of the member of the staff of the college whose advice they may seek on all matters relating to their studies and other activities in and out of the college.

2. Each ward is expected to see his tutor periodically atleast once in a month or at such a time as may be fixed by the tutor and give him a report of what has been done by him during the period and get his advice on all matters connected with the activities of the college.

3. Tutorial meetings will be conducted once in a week by each tutor for giving the students proper guidance on points of academic and general interest. No student shall be absent from these meetings without the permission of his tutor.

4. Leave application should always be in the prescribed form and should always be submitted to tutors concerned. Leave will be sanctioned by the Principal on the recommendations of the tutor.

### ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. Students are not permitted to absent themselves without leave.

(iii) Absence without leave will be viewed seriously. Such students will be liable for loss of stipend and/or fine and/or other punishment at the discretion of the Principal.

(iv) (a) A student may be dismissed if he is absent without leave for three whole consecutive working days or for periods aggregating to five whole days.

(b) A student shall forfeit all stipends during any period of absence without leave, however short it may be. Absence without leave for a part of a day will be treated as absence for a whole day for this purpose.

(c) The principal may grant leave without diminution or loss of a stipend for a period not exceeding one month to stipendiaries who are absent in consequence of severe sickness, but if the leave exceeds this period, casual leave without diminution or loss of stipend may be granted for genuine reasons for a period not exceeding 15 days in the year provided such leave does not immediately precede or succeed the holidays,

(V) Leave may be granted amounting to not more than seven days at a time, exclusive of Sundays and other holidays and not more than fifteen days in the year. In case of real necessity additional leave may be given, but it shall be leave without stipend in the case of stipendary students. Pandits under training may be granted casual leave upto a maximum of seven days during the whole course and not more than four days at a time exclusive of Sundays and other holidays. Leave on medical grounds may be granted for a period not exceeding 15 days during the whole course.

(vi) The period of absence in any one spell inclusive of casual leave, should not exceed ten days, except on medical grounds.

(vii) Where leave is applied on the grounds of sickness, the production of medical certificate by a registered medical practitioner is compulsory.

3. The necessary attendance certificate, will not be given unless the Principal is satisfied that a student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory and that he has attended three fourths of the number of working days in the academic year.

4. For the purpose of the college certificates, and attendance of 85 percent of the total number of actual working days of the College will be regarded as satisfactory attendance.

5. A student may be dismissed by the Director of Collegiate Education for continued idleness or serious misconduct and if so dismissed, he may be declared unfit for employment as a teacher if he is a stipendiary student, he shall also be required to refund the whole amount drawn by him from Provincial, Local or Municipal fund.

6. There will be flag hoisting and assembly at the commencement of the forenoon session on the first working day of every week. Attendance is compulsory, absence without leave during the flag hoisting and assembly, besides involving loss of attendance for half a day, will be seriously viewed. Besides, no student shall absent himself from the flag hoisting and assembly either on the Independence day or on the Republic Day, failing which the certificate of their conduct and progress will be withheld.

#### RULES REGARDING THE LIBRARY

1. The library is sub-divided into (i) reference section and (ii) lending section.

2. The library will be under the supervision of a Professor of the College appointed by the Principal.

3. The library is open to all students and members of the staff of the College.

4. The library will be kept open on every working day from 9 a. m. to 4-30 p. m. and will remain closed on Sundays and on all recognised holidays.

5. Books from the reference section shall not be taken out of the library except with the written authorisation of the Principal. They can be consulted in the library room on all days during which the library remains open.

6. Strict silence shall be observed in the library.

7. The ticket system of issue is followed for lending books from the general library.

8. The issue of books from the lending section is governed by the following rules :-

(i) Each student will be given one ticket only by librarian. A student can exchange a ticket for a book at any time and when he returns the book to the library, he must get his ticket returned to him. If he returns the book after the due date he will get back ticket only on payment of the prescribed fee. Books to be returned must be handed over to the librarian before 2p.m. on any working day.

(ii) Tickets are not transferable. If a book is borrowed through wrongful use of a ticket, the holder of the ticket will be held responsible.

(iii) Books cannot be sublent. Those who violate this rule will be severely punished.

(iv) Application for books must be carefully filled in, on requisition forms provided for the purpose, and these forms can be obtained from the librarian.

(v) All applications for books should be handed over to the librarian before 2 p. m. and the books will be issued generally between 3-30 p.m. and 4-30 p m on the same day.

(vi) If the book is wanted by more than one applicant, it will be issued in the order of priority of the applications.

(vii) All markings, underlining; etc , on books are punishable with fine or with the offender being called upon to replace the book or both.

(viii) The Student must satisfy himself as to whether the book issued to him is in sound condition, and if it is not, bring the matter to the notice of Librarian. For all damages to books noticed at the time of their return to the library, the borrower will be held responsible and he will have to pay the cost of replacement.



(ix) If a book is lost by a borrower, he must at once report the loss to the Principal. He must replace the book by a new copy of the same or if the book is out of print, he has to pay the cost of replacing it with any fine that the Principal may impose upon him.

(X) If one book out of a set is lost and can not be replaced by itself the cost of replacing the whole set will be recovered from the person responsible for the loss.

(xi) Periodicals, Reference books etc., which might be difficult to replace and such other books as may from the time to time regarded as unsuitable for lending will not be lent out.

### HOSTEL

The Govt. College of Edn. Hostel which is intended mainly for the trainees living away from their parents or guardians is under the direct control and supervision of the Principal who is the Ex-officio Warden of the hostel. He is assisted by the Deputy Warden, Manager and an Advisory Committee consisting of staff members nominated by the Principal, and student representative elected by the inmates of the hostel.

Each member shall, on admission, pay :-

- (i) A caution deposit of Rs. 250/- which is refundable on his leaving the hostel.
- (ii) Registration fee Rs. 8/-
- (iii) Medical fee Rs. 6/-
- (iv) Audit fee Rs. 1-50
- (v) Maintenance fee Rs 5/-  
(Subject to revision)

The total charges on the mess for the month will be divided equally among the members of the mess. The mess dues of each month, the room rent, the establishment charges etc., should be paid on or before the 15th of the following month, failing which a fine of 10 paise per day will be levied after that date till the 25th, If the dues are not paid with the fine even by the 25th names of the defaulters shall be removed from the rolls, and they shall cease.

to be members of hostel and shall vacate their rooms forthwith. They may be re-admitted into the hostel at the discretion of the Warden, only on payment of a re-admission fee of Re/-1. The Principal, at his discretion, may permit the payment of the hostel dues on a date later than the 15th in special circumstances such as break in the normal function of the College during the Period of Teaching Practice, Camps, etc, and also waive the levy in respect of students belonging to the Backward and Scheduled Caste and candidates deputed by the T.N.P.S.C. and those in receipt of scholarships or stipends, provided these students give it in writing that all the outstanding arrears will be cleared on the date of the scholarship or stipend are paid to them.

A rebate of  $1/2$  the daily rate of mess charges will be allowed when a student is absent with leave for more than five days consecutively in the month, excluding the first five days.

The members of hostel shall not change room or remove furniture and fittings from one room to another except with the prior approval of the Deputy Warden. The members shall be responsible for the safe return of the hostel articles which they are permitted to use in their rooms.

The members will be served their food or tiffin only at the dining hall, except in case of illness, when the Manager may permit the food to be served in the rooms.

The members at the time of admission shall provide themselves with bulb, lock, can and bucket. No member shall tamper with the electric or other installations or fittings in the hostel or use any bulb of over 40 watts or extra lights, electric heater, electric iron, table fan or other electric appliances.

No guest will be allowed to lodge or board in the hostel. No outsider including the day-students, shall be permitted to occupy any room in the hostel, nor shall they remain in the hostel premises after 8-30 p.m.. fine of Rs. 5/- will be imposed if any unauthorised guest is found in a room after 8-30 p.m.

Except with the special permission of the Deputy warden no inmate shall stay away from the hostel or leave it after 9 p.m. Students of the hostel are expected to be in their rooms and to put in an hour of study before the commencement of night meal service. Persistent disregard of the study hour will be viewed as a serious breach of discipline.

Member of the hostel shall on no account deal directly or find fault with the servants of the hostel. Complaints and suggestions, if any, may be made to the Deputy Warden in writing.

Any violation of the hostel rules or breach of discipline is liable to be dealt with by fine, suspension, or expulsion temporarily or permanently. Expulsion from the hostel will entail expulsion from the College also.



## DEGREE OF MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY (M. PHIL)

A candidate who has qualified himself for the Degree of Master of Education of University of Madras or of any other University recognised by the syndicate as equivalent thereto will be eligible to register for the Degree of Master of Philosophy (M. Phil) in Education and undergo the prescribed course of study.

The duration of the M. Phil. Course shall extend over a period from 1st July to 30th April.

The syllabus and the course will be prescribed by the guide subject to the approval by the Board of Studies concerned.

The following subjects are offered in this college :

1. Research Methodology and Educational Statistics;
2. Curriculum Development;
3. Educational Technology (internal).

The Scheme of Examination shall be as follows

The guide shall at his discretion determine the details of the constituents of the Examination within the scheme of Examination.

The evaluation shall be distributed **equally** between course work and dissertation and the results of candidates shall be graded as follows.

Grade C

Grade A will denote a pass in the M. Phil. with eligibility to proceed to do further research work.

Grade B will denote a pass in the M. phil. but not to do further research work.

Grade C will denote failure.



# DEGREE OF MASTER OF EDUCATION (M.Ed.)

## Regulations

### 1. Eligibility for admission to the course and Examination.

A candidate shall be admitted to the course provided he has passed a Degree Examination in Education of Madras University or a Degree Examination in Education of some other University recognised by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto.

No candidate shall be admitted to the Examination unless he has taken the qualifying degree in Education.

No candidate shall be eligible for the degree of M.Ed., unless he has completed the prescribed course of study and has passed the qualifying examination and has satisfied the Examiners in a thesis on an approved topic.

### 2. General Framework :

1. The course will be for a duration of one academic year, consisting of 180 working days.

2. The course of study will comprise three core subjects and two elective subjects, each carrying 100 marks. The thesis, a compulsory requirement, will carry 200 marks.

Thesis :

(a) Candidates shall be required to submit a thesis and an abstract of thesis on a subject approved by the University. The thesis shall embody the record of original investigation or a critical study of existing data or a combination of both. The thesis shall be prepared under the direction of a Teacher approved by the University. The topic proposed for a thesis shall ordinarily be submitted to the University not later than 31st August of the year of admission to the course.

(b) Each thesis shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by the Supervisor and countersigned by the Principal to the effect that the thesis has been prepared under the direction of the Supervisor and that it has not been the basis for the award of any degree or diploma. The last date for submission of the thesis shall be one month before the commencement of the University Examination.

(b) Each written paper shall be valued by two external examiners separately and the average of the marks awarded by them shall be taken as the final external marks provided the difference between the marks given by the two examiners is 10% or less. If the difference is over 10% the concerned answer paper shall be sent to a third examiner for valuation whose valuation shall be final.

(c) Each thesis shall be valued by two external examiners separately and the average of the marks awarded by them shall be taken as the final marks provided the difference between their mark is 10% or less. When the examiners differ in their valuation by more than 10% the thesis shall be sent to a third examiner for valuation whose valuation shall be final.

## 5. Marks qualifying for a pass :

The minimum marks for a pass in each paper and the thesis shall be 50%.

Candidates who fail in any subject or subjects shall have to appear for those examinations. Candidates who fail in the thesis shall have to re-submit the thesis. Candidates who secure more than 60% in the exam. shall be declared to have passed in I class.

## 6. Holder of the M.Ed. Degree qualifying for an additional subject:

A candidate who has taken the M.Ed. degree in one elective subject shall be permitted to appear again for the examination in a new elective subject, provided he has attended course in the elective subject and forwards his application through the college where he underwent the course.

Such candidates shall not be admitted at a convocation second time, but a special certificate setting forth the additional subject passed by him and the date of examination shall be given to him.

## DIPLOMA IN HIGHER EDUCATION (D.H.Ed.) Regulations

### 1. Eligibility for the Course

No candidate shall be eligible for the course unless he is a teacher working in a college or in a department of University and has taken a Master's Degree in this University or in some other University accepted by the syndicate as equivalent thereto and has undergone the prescribed course of study and passed the prescribed examination.

### 2. Eligibility for admission to Examination

No candidate shall be admitted to the Diploma Examination unless he forwards along with the application for examination satisfactory evidence of having qualified for the Master's Degree in this University or some other University accepted by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto, and produces a certificate that he has undergone the prescribed course in an affiliated college of Education or the Department of Education, University of Madras.

6. Project work.

#### 4 Duration of the Course :

The duration of the course is 200 hours. This college offers the course on a part time basis in the evenings at the rate of two hours per day for three days a week for one full academic year.

A candidate shall be declared to have passed the practical examination if he obtains (a) not less than 40 percent in Teaching Competency in each of the two optional subjects and (b) not less than 40 percent of the marks allotted for the other aspects of practical work taken together.



Successful candidates shall be classified separately for written examination and practical examination. In each case, candidates who pass the examination and obtain not less than 60 percent of total marks shall be placed in the First Class and those who obtain between 50 and 59 percent shall be placed in the Second Class. The remaining successful candidates shall be in placed the Third Class.



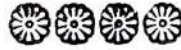
