To overcome this problem the mentoring system was adopted in the college.

The mentors, with constant counselling helps the students to cope up with their personal problems. This help the students to be closer to the teacher in charge.

THE PRACTICES:

Each staff members is allotted 30-40 students and she/he is a mentor for throughout the year. The mentors sheets have been designed to make provision to improve to all academic, co curricular and personal details \of the candidate including is/her family during the degree.

The mentor point out strength and area for the development in each student she/ he also help the student to set long term career goals and short-term learning objectives to enables them to perform effectively.
